Summary

Seeking a volunteer to oversee the creative learning of the missionary children and several staff children at Malamulo Adventist Hospital. The classes are kept small since they are multi-grade and may include students new to English learning. In addition to school activities, some volunteers have helped with Pathfinders and Sabbath School or assisted with outreach to villages nearby. Worksite is on an Adventist college campus so there is opportunity for interaction with Malawian young people. The campus is nestled in the beautiful tea plantations of Malawi's Thyolo District. Camping, hiking, visiting game parks, taking basket-making lessons are some of the activities volunteers have enjoyed in the past. Missionary families often include volunteers in their activities such as backpacking, Sabbath walks, potlucks, so that the volunteers can feel supported in our community.

Cost breakdown:

Volunteer Fundraises:

- Insurance (approximately \$800 total for 9 months).
- Temporary Residence Permit (\$500) entry visa is free, but must be converted to Temporary Residence Permit within 90 days which costs \$500USD.
- Ticket (Round-trip approximately \$3000 if coming from USA)
- Immunizations (amount varies)
- Total trip expenses to fundraised/paid: **\$4800**

Malamulo covers:

- Accommodations/Utilities/guesthouse meals: \$600/month x 9 months = \$5400 (hospital guesthouse charges \$600/mo which include meals)
- \$150/month living allowance (\$150x 9 mo. = \$1350).
- Local travel: varies, but you can book hospital transport or join missionaries when they go to town to shop (local transport to town approximately = \$5/trip).
- Malamulo's contribution \$6750 + local travel.

Room and board are sponsored by the hospital. Volunteer(s) live(s) in a flat in the hospital guesthouse. They may eat at the guesthouse dining room or prepare their own meals in their room (there is a hotplate and small fridge available). Travel to town for groceries and incidentals can be arranged with hospital transport or with missionaries when they are going to town.

Restrictions:

Housing is a one-room apartment that is shared by volunteers, so in the case that two volunteers want to serve, they need to be the same gender (unless a married couple) and reasonably sure they can manage living and working together.

Health Notes

Malaria is endemic in Malawi. We test and treat readily at the hospital so prophylaxis is an individual choice. Note: Doxycycline is available as prophylaxis, but other drugs such as Malarone are not readily available. We recommend carrying your vaccination records. Refer to CDC recommendations to guide vaccination. While yellow-fever vaccination is not required in Malawi, it may come up during travel through some African countries. Hepatitis A, B, and Typhoid are common in the local population--vaccination for those is recommended.

Dress

Acceptable:

Conservative, fairly formal dress is the norm here. Women mostly wear skirts/dresses--always below the knee. Women can wear slacks, but they should not be tight. Jeans are never worn in the workplace. Men wear slacks (not shorts) in the workplace.

Unacceptable:

Dresses or skirts above the knee, low-cut blouses for women. I have not seen Adventist women wear shorts, spaghetti straps, sleeveless tops or tight clothing.

Duties

Oversee the learning of elementary-aged children of missionary staff and some hospital staff children for Malamulo Adventist Hospital. Volunteer works in a well-equipped, multi-grade classroom. Some lesson planning will be needed for older students, but the younger ones will learn primarily in a play-based model. Learning will be from 8am-12pm, 2pm-4pm daily with half-day on Fridays. Holidays observed are the Malawian public holidays. A break of two weeks at Christmas (in case volunteers wish to travel) and another week in March will be observed. Volunteer English proficiency is required since some students may be new to the language.

Malaria is endemic, but testing and treatment is readily available at the hospital so prophylaxis is an individual choice. Typhoid, Hep A and B are common, so vaccination is recommended. Cholera vaccine can be obtained in Malawi if desired. Yellow fever is not required in Malawi, but it may come up if one travels to other countries nearby. We recommend carrying your vaccination records with you to Malawi. Check CDC recommendations for travel to this country.

Exercise increased caution in Malawi due to **crime** and **civil unrest**.

Country Summary: Violent Crime such as theft, burglary, armed robbery, assault, and carjacking is common. The capabilities of the Malawi Police Service are growing but its resources and abilities to deter and investigate crimes, assist victims, and apprehend criminals are limited.

Demonstrations may occur and increase in frequency around political issues and events such as elections. Teargas is frequently deployed at demonstrations and roads may be blocked.
