Program Expectations

The CAMPUS Missionary Training Program is a season of intentional formation—spiritual, academic, and practical—designed to equip interns for faithful and effective campus ministry. Participants are invited to commit fully to the following expectations as part of their growth as student missionaries:

1. Small Group Ministry

Interns are expected to **faithfully support and serve within at least one small group each semester**, contributing to discipleship, community building, and spiritual growth among students.

2. Academic & Training Engagement

Interns are expected to **attend, and actively participate in all required classes and training sessions**, approaching each learning opportunity with diligence, curiosity, and a desire to integrate theory with ministry practice.

3. Bible Study Development & Record-Keeping

Interns are expected to **identify, cultivate, and conduct Bible studies**, while maintaining clear and accurate records of Bible study interests throughout the program year as part of responsible and intentional ministry engagement.

4. Ministry Leadership & Field Experience

Interns are expected to **lead and collaborate with others** in student visitations, prayer ministry, Bible studies, and church outreach initiatives, growing in confidence, compassion, and leadership through hands-on campus ministry.

5. Innovative Mission on Public Campuses

Interns are expected to **prayerfully and creatively develop innovative approaches** to reaching students on public college and university campuses, seeking effective, culturally relevant, and missionally faithful ways to engage the campus community.

6. Weekly Formation & Accountability Meetings

Interns are required to **meet with CAMPUS staff every Monday morning** for weekly reflection, evaluation, encouragement, and guidance, fostering accountability, spiritual formation, and ministry alignment.

7. Program Policies & Christlike Conduct

Interns are expected to **honor and abide by all CAMPUS program policies**, demonstrating integrity, responsibility, and Christlike character in all areas of life and ministry.

8. Final Research Project & Ministry Presentation

As a culminating component of the Missionary Training Program, interns are expected to **design and complete a final research project, ministry resource, and/or presentation** that integrates academic learning with lived

ministry experience.

This final project should serve as a **reflective and missional expression** of the intern's growth, theological understanding, and practical engagement during their time in the program. Interns will **present their work to CAMPUS staff** at the conclusion of the program year as both an academic summary and a testimony of their missionary journey.
