The role requires a servant-hearted commitment, with a modest living allowance of about \$350/month plus housing support for the 2026–2027 school year.

Dishes are prepared simply—grilled, steamed, boiled, or in mild stews—to keep them healthy and flavorful.

Additional Meals: You can buy extra meals (breakfast, dinner, or more portions) for just \$1 each, which makes it easy and affordable for busy days.

Challenges for Westerners: Imported Western foods (like certain snacks, cereals, or dairy) are often limited or costly because of shipping. This means the diet centers more on fresh local produce, grains, and proteins—healthier in many ways, though it takes some adjustment from typical Western eating.

Restrictions:

Campus After Dark at Chuuk SDA School: After dark, the campus is fully secured and locked for everyone's safety in our remote island setting. All students, teachers, missionaries, and staff are required to be on campus by sunset (typically 6:00–7:00 PM), creating a peaceful, protected environment where everyone can rest, study, or enjoy quiet fellowship together in a safe and nurturing space.

Acceptable:

Men teach in long professional pants but may wear shorts off campus or after school. Men must wear collared shirts to church meetings.

Unacceptable:

Classroom & Academic Management: Keep accurate records of student attendance, grades, and performance. Create lesson plans, course outlines, and visual aids (e.g., posters, bulletin boards) to foster a positive, clean learning environment. Manage student behavior in class, on school grounds, and during activities per the school's handbook rules.

School Operations & Support: Handle janitorial tasks in/around your classroom. Supervise students during lunch and other assigned times (rotating with colleagues). Perform additional duties as assigned by administration, aligning with school policies and programs.

Professional Development & Collaboration: Attend staff meetings, school events (including after hours), in-service training, and workshops to improve teaching skills. Work cooperatively with colleagues and administration.

Church & Community Involvement: Participate in weekend church services and assist with ministries based on your talents (e.g., leading Sabbath School classes, Pathfinder club, youth meetings, door-to-door outreach, prison ministry, or other programs). This role emphasizes holistic education—academic, behavioral, and spiritual—while integrating faith and community service.
