Dorm life is enhanced by excellent campus amenities just steps away: a gymnasium, basketball court, and pickleball court for sports, recreation, and staying active, our school café, which provides one free lunch meal every school day — with additional meals available for just \$1, a dedicated teachers' lounge where faculty can relax, socialize, and enjoy meaningful fellowship together, a brand-new, air-conditioned Toyota HiAce 12-passenger van that transports teachers to town for shopping twice a week — making errands and outings easy and comfortable.

Daily Free Lunch for Teachers: Every teacher gets a free lunch at the café. Meals use fresh, local ingredients like fish, chicken, root crops such as breadfruit, taro, yam, and sweet potato, along with rice, tropical fruits (like bananas), and vegetables. Dishes are prepared simply—grilled, steamed, boiled, or in mild stews—to keep them

healthy and flavorful.

Additional Meals: You can buy extra meals (breakfast, dinner, or more portions) for just \$1 each, which makes it easy and affordable for busy days.

Challenges for Westerners: Imported Western foods (like certain snacks, cereals, or dairy) are often limited or costly because of shipping. This means the diet centers more on fresh local produce, grains, and proteins—healthier in many ways, though it takes some adjustment from typical Western eating.

Restrictions:

Campus After Dark at Chuuk SDA School: After dark, the campus is fully secured and locked for everyone's safety in our remote island setting. All students, teachers, missionaries, and staff are required to be on campus by sunset (typically 6:00–7:00 PM), creating a peaceful, protected environment where everyone can rest, study, or enjoy quiet fellowship together in a safe and nurturing space.

Acceptable:

Men teach in long professional pants but may wear shorts off campus or after school. Men must wear collared shirts to church meetings.

Women must always wear loose fitting skirts and dresses past the knee when going off campus or "in public" on campus. Women may wear modest shorts, slacks or pants only on campus in the evening or when exercising.

Unacceptable:

Women - Tight and/or short shorts are never acceptable, nor sleeveless or sheer blouses or dresses.

A conservative hairstyle is preferred for men and women.

Duties

Duties: We are looking for a calm and patient Learning Support Assistant to help in the classroom by supporting the teacher with behavior and keeping the class running smoothly. You will work with students (often 1-to-1 or in small groups) to help them follow rules, stay on task, manage their emotions, and join in lessons. The role includes using positive behavior strategies, helping children calm down when needed, giving clear reminders, supporting transitions between activities, and assisting during busy times like lining up or group work. This is a

hands-on, term-time role that needs someone kind, consistent, and good at building trust with children.

- Calm and patient personality
- Ability to stay calm when children are upset or behaving in a challenging manner
