Main volunteer apartments have Wi-Fi access; Volunteer share an air-conditioned apartment with other volunteers of the same gender; Shared bathroom with hot water; Basic furniture, bed, and drawer/closet space are provided.; Kitchen is supplied with a stove or counter-top burner, a refrigerator, a microwave oven, rice cooker, and toaster; Tableware, flatware, basic cooking utensils, kettles and frying pans are provided; A bucket, mop, broom, dustpan, and toilet brush are provided; Volunteer provides his/her own pillow, sheets, blankets, towels, dish clothes/towels, and cleaning supplies.

Food

Volunteers prepare their own meals. A monthly stipend of \$500.00 cover groceries and personal needs. Most

food is imported from the US, China, and Taiwan, so prices can be higher. American, Japanese, Korean, Chinese, and Filipino food brands are available on the island. There's imported beef, chicken, and salmon but local fresh fish is abundant. There are also several vegetarian options.

Acceptable:

Work Uniform

Male: long pants – dress slacks or khaki pants, no denim Female: loose-fitting, below the knee skirts

Both: solid-colored collared polo shirts, closed shoes or sandals – Oxford, loafers

Church Clothes

Male: long pants – dress slacks or khaki pants, no denim, collared shirt, and button-up shirts, closed shoes – Oxford, loafers

Female: below the knee skirts and dresses, sleeveless is only allowed with cardigan on, church shoes

Female: mid-thigh or longer shorts, jeans, t-shirts, flip-flops, Tevas/Chacos, sneakers
